


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First stop is a rather shabby bed and breakfast in the town of St. Helier on the Isle of Jersey, a tax haven that is part of the United Kingdom.

Next stop on the Grand Tour is Belfast, in Northern Ireland. We are staying at the Old Rectory Inn—do you notice a theme here?




Pigletté and BoBo like the comfortable room we have. It has a view to the courtyard and a great breakfast, not like that one on Jersey.




The Opera House is amazing with it's lounge stuck out over the sidewalk. Tonight we are going to see a play.




Everybody at the bar is dressed up and ready to party.

Here we see UncleMarkie on a rope bridge that crosses a great ravine. You aren't scared of heights, are you?




This is Walter. He is from Scotland. He is staying at the Youth Hostel in Belfast. He doesn't look hostile to us!

It looks cold!






Look at those strange rock formations! Legend says that the Giants would use these to walk to Scotland.
